II. Approval of meeting minutes:

III. Old Business:

Implementation of the new reading program, year 3, and math program, year 2, is going well. We are still working to make sure we stay on task to teach what and when we are supposed to teach with fidelity.

IV. New Business:

1. NAEP Testing:

We have been randomly selected by NAEP to be part of a national assessment of educational progress between January and March for 4th grade math. A randomly selected class and then a group of students within that class will be selected to participate in the assessment. The results are not posted.

2. Science :

There needs to be an initial discussion about reviewing the science curriculum . It will begin towards the end of this school year but most of the work will be done next year.

4. New Middle School Report Card:

The new middle school report card took a lot of reworking of physical software. The standards are still part of the report card but there will be no individual grade for them. Individual subject areas will be graded based on assessments related to the standards. The lowest grade on the report card will be 50. The summative grade will reflect all the standards of the subject area. Chris Pickett has a really good graph of the expectations needed to be used for grading to keep it consistent among teachers. As we pilot the new report card there may be some modifications that need to be made.

5. Team meetings:

Teachers meet once a week to look at targeted areas. They talk about specific things like pacing guides, tiered instruction, smarter balance assessment scores, etc.

6. Pacing guides are used to make sure the content is covered over the course of the year at relatively the same pace consistent with other teachers.

7. Learning Walks:

The 4 person administrative team is going to start learning walks lasting 5 - 10 minutes to get a pulse on what is happening within the school, compliment when appropriate, and determine if any global adjustments should be made. It is not evaluative. It will be announced at first and then will continue as a habit throughout the year.
